Who we are

WHERE WE OPERATE



Still I Rise operates in Kolwezi, a mining town in the southern region of the Democratic Republic of Congo (DRC).

Our mission is to provide quality education and life skills to vulnerable children who have been marginalized due to difficult living conditions, including child labor in the mines.



Who we are

PAMOJA ACADEMY

Still I Rise Academy - Kolwezi (Pamoja) is our emergency and rehabilitation school located in the Mutoshi area, near one of the world's most important mining districts.

Kolwezi, known as the "cobalt capital" and home to "rare earths," is a city in the southern region of the Democratic Republic of Congo (DRC), from which over half of the global cobalt production originates.


Our Context

KOLWEZI MINES

The mining industry is the primary source of employment in Kolwezi, divided into mining zones managed mainly by foreign multinational companies.

Alongside these large-scale operations, small-scale artisanal miners, known as "creuseurs", contribute 20% of the national production.

These artisanal miners work under extremely harsh and dangerous conditions, and regrettably, many of them are children.





Our Context

CHILD LABOR IN COBALT MINES

According to UNICEF, approximately
40,000 children work in cobalt mines,
facing perilous conditions and
enduring violence, extortion, and
intimidation.

These children, aged 8 to 14, engage in hazardous tasks such as digging, transporting, sorting, and washing minerals, often in environments that put their safety and well-being at significant risk.





Our Context

MUTOMBO'S STORY

Mutombo, living in Kolwezi with his wife and six children, works as a miner in the copper mines of Mutoshi, a job he began after moving from Nkombe in early 2022. His work is dangerous and poorly paid, often leaving him with insufficient income to support his family.

Despite the harsh conditions,

Mutombo is determined to provide
a better future for his children.

One of his sons was admitted to
Pamoja School, run by Still I Rise, which
also supports the family with food kits.

While Mutombo dreams of his son completing his education to help the family, economic struggles force another son, Magloire, to continue working in the mines.

For Mutombo, Still I Rise represents hope for a better future.











100% OF OUR FINALISTS PASS THE EXAM

In June 2024, our first cohort of Level 3 students at Pamoja Academy took the national examination, the final step in the Programme National De Rattrapage Scolaire (PNRS). This accelerated program covers the formal primary school curriculum in three years and prepares students for re-entry into formal schooling and secondary education.

PNRS OBJECTIVES



Provide basic education leading to a recognized primary school completion certificate.



Equip children with skills for future vocational and career development.



Guide children toward further secondary education.





EXAMINATION RESULTS


In 2024, 16 out of 18 Level 3 students were admitted to the national examination as finalists. All passed, officially graduating from the program.

This year the two students who did not complete the year were due to reasons of misconduct. In both cases, it was deemed more advantageous

64.64%



NEXT STEPS

Eleven students are set to transition from Still I Rise to La Grandeur private school with full support for fees, uniforms, and transportation. La Grandeur offers a well-rounded education, modern facilities, and extracurricular activities.

Continued support depends on maintaining good behavior, 90% attendance, and academic progress toward secondary certification, with support capped at two years. This will be checked every term from the SIR team. Additionally, four students will enter the International Student Scholarship Program, preparing for Still I Rise's International School in Nairobi.


